Academic Dishonesty/Cheating Policy

Academic Dishonesty/Cheating includes one or more of the following actions:

- To plagiarize, which includes using another person's words, ideas, or work without giving proper credit to that person. Plagiarism applies to all forms of work, including papers, projects, speeches, and presentations
- To submit the work of another person as your own
- To copy information from another student's assignment (unless allowed to do so by teacher)
- To supply another student information that can be used to cheat on an assignment
- To fail to follow assignment procedures or instructions announced by a teacher (such as the unprohibited use of an electronic device or talking during the completion of an assignment)
- To have in possession a copy of a teacher's test without that teacher's authorization
- To use a textbook or notes during the completion of a test, quiz, or any other assignment (unless allowed to do so by teacher)

If a student violates the academic dishonesty/cheating policy, he or she will receive a zero for the assignment and there will be no opportunity to change that grade. Also, a referral will be completed and submitted to an administrator for documentation purposes. There are no exceptions. If a student violates the academic dishonesty/cheating policy, the violation will result in **denial of acceptance into or dismissal from all Conway High School honor societies.**
