



School attire should reflect cleanliness and comfort. Parents/guardians are responsible for assuring that individual students dress in an appropriate manner at all times while students are on campus or involved in school activities. Generally, student dress is considered appropriate as long as it does not or foreseeably could not, interfere with the educational process, cause disruption, serve as evidence of a disrespectful nature, or damage school property. The school will make judgments and decisions as needed to preserve the health, safety, and decorum of students.

1. Attire or personal belonging must comply with requirements for health and safety.
2. Hats/headwear, sunglasses, bandannas, headphones/earplugs, sweatbands, combs/picks, hoodies, etc. are not to be worn in school. Items will be confiscated and may be picked up by parents at their convenience.
3. Chains, knives, steel knuckles, etc., should not be brought to or worn at school.
4. Attire or personal belonging must not be immodest, obscene, profane, lewd, vulgar, indecent, or offensive.

The following regulations apply to all students:

- Shorts, skirts, and dresses should be of adequate length to assure modesty when the student is seated or engaged in school activities. Adequate length is no more than 3 inches above the knee.
 - Spandex/form-fitting pants/leggings must be worn with a shirt, skirt, or dress that is **at least** fingertip length.
 - No skateboards, skates, or shoes with skates are allowed at CHS.
 - No bedroom shoes or pajama-type pants are allowed.
 - Fishnet, tank tops, and see-through clothing are prohibited. Cut-off shirts, halters, or clothes exposing the mid-section are not allowed. Shirts and blouses are to be buttoned appropriately.
 - Tops with “spaghetti straps” are inappropriate, as are tops that reveal cleavage, shoulders, or back. Shoulder straps must be at least two (2”) inches wide, without undergarments exposed.
 - Undergarments must be worn at all times and covered.
 - Outer garments must conceal undergarments. Boxer/gym/spandex shorts worn under other clothing must be covered. Plastic zip ties can be used by administrators to secure sagging pants.
 - Additional guidelines may be established by the administration.
5. Attire or personal belongings must not evidence membership or affiliation with a “gang” in any negative sense of the term.
 6. Attire or personal belongings must not display any information about, representations of, or advertisements for alcoholic beverage(s), tobacco, controlled drugs, or illegal drugs or paraphernalia associated with any of these. Clothing must not promote weapons, sexual behavior, or be ethnically derogatory.

Dress Code Interventions

The student will be asked to call home for a change of clothes. The student **will not be allowed** to return to class until the situation has been corrected. The student will remain in ISS until a change of clothes has arrived.

Due to continued issues with sagging pants the following specific interventions will be applied:

Students will be offered the option of zip-tying their pants or being sent to ISS for the remainder of the day.

Consequences for Dress Code Violations

First Referral– 1 Day ASD with parent contact by administrator and with student changing to compliant dress before return to class

Second Referral– 2 Days ASD with parent contact by administrator and with student changing to compliant dress before return to class

Third Referral – 1-3 days OSS

Fourth Referral – 3-5 days OSS

Fifth Referral – Recommendation for evidentiary hearing
