

Parent & Family Engagement Policy Horry County Schools


- Encourage, support, and value the participation and engagement of parents and families in the educational experiences of their children
- Commit to developing family-friendly schools, offices, and programs that welcome and serve parents and families in positive and supportive environments
- Develop relationships of shared responsibility and mutual support
- Assist parents in learning how home environments can support the academic achievement of students
- Offer strategies such as parenting classes, home visitation opportunities, and adult education programs to support parents
- Provide special assistance to ensure non-English speaking parents also participate as full partners in their child's education
- Include parents as valuable contributors and participants to the educational process
- Encourage parents to participate on a committee that meets 3 times a year and as members of parent organizations, such as our RES PTO at both the school and district levels and to serve as volunteers for classroom, school, and district-wide activities
- Offer professional development opportunities for teachers, administrators, and other district employees to enhance the ability of schools to effectively service all students, parents, and families (see school newsletters)



Horry County Schools shall also implement the following provisions set forth by the ESEA Legislation:

 Properly Certified - Parents have the right to ask the school administration if a teacher possesses proper certification to teach the grade and content area to which he or she has been assigned. Parents have the right to notice if students are taught more than four consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified.



Provide coordination, technical assistance, and other support necessary to assist participating schools in planning and implementing effective Parent and Family Engagement Activities

Parents involved in decisions regarding how funds are allotted for Parent and Family Activities	
Not less than 1% of the Title I Allocation will be reserved for Parent and Family Engagement Activities including family literacy and parenting skills	
Not less than 95% of the funds reserved for Parental & Family Engagement shall be distributed to schools and used for activities such as parent education work- shops and home visits	
Provide training to school staff, administration, and parents to strengthen Parent Engagement efforts	
Provide a school counselor program in coordination with mental health counselors in order to provide services such as individual and group counseling, home visits, character education, and career education programs
