DRESS CODE

Students, Parents/guardians are responsible for ensuring that individual students dress in an appropriate manner at all times while on campus or when involved in school activities.

- 1. Attire must comply with requirements for health and safety.
- 2. Attire must not be immodest, obscene, profane, lewd, vulgar, indecent, or offensive. Shorts, skirts, and dresses should be fingertip length when a student's arms are extended by his/her side to assure modesty when the student is seated or engaged in school activities.
- 3. Appropriate undergarments should be worn and should be covered by outer clothing and not visible to others. Tops must not reveal cleavage. Exposed midriff apparel, swimming attire, pajamas, bedroom slippers, and exposed lingerie may not be worn.
- 4. Attire must not show membership or affiliation with a "gang" in any negative sense of the term. Bandanas or colors affiliated with a gang may not be worn.

5. Attire, masks, and jewelry must not display any information about, representations of, or advertisements for alcoholic beverages, tobacco, controlled drugs, sexual innuendos, and/or illegal drugs/paraphernalia. Any clothing with images, words or phrases deemed inappropriate in nature may not be worn. Any clothing, masks, or jewelry containing derogatory, threatening, or violent words/phrases may not be worn.

- 6. Hats, sunglasses, or headgear may not be worn in the building.
- 7. Pants and other garments are to be worn appropriately on the waist, preferably with a belt. Buttons are to be buttoned, zippers zipped, snaps snapped, and straps secured as designed. Pants are not allowed to sag, and underwear should never be exposed.
- 8. Jeans with holes must not be immodest and/or incident.
- 9. Form fitting pants (yoga, leggings, jeggings etc...) must not be immodest and/or indecent.
- 10. Tank tops must have a shoulder strap width of three adult fingertips.
- 11. See-through clothing, spaghetti strap tops, or clothes exposing the mid-section or bare shoulders are not allowed.

Dress Code Violation

Students will be checked for appropriate dress attire during advisory and 1st academic classes.

- ♦ ♦ 1st Offense: Phone call home by administrator, change of clothes, and admin, documented verbal warning, 1st referral
- ♦ ◆ 2nd Offense: Phone call home by administrator, ISS until a change of clothes is brought to school, 2nd documented referral
- ♦ ◆ 3rd Offense: Administrator conference with parent/guardian is required, ISS assignment, and 3rd documented referral

******* Subsequent Offenses: Further consequences assigned by administration and documented as a referral.
